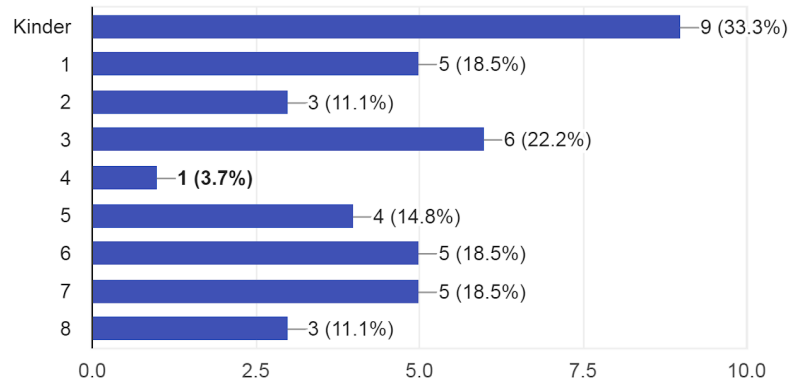

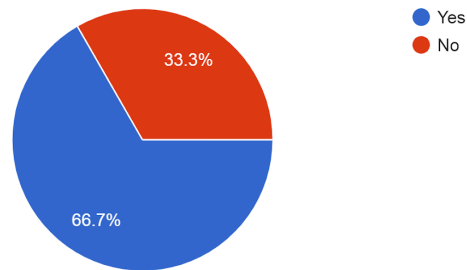
Grade of student(s) check all that apply

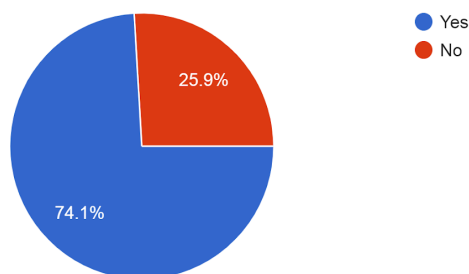
Would you like to offer advice on the school's action plan for improvement?

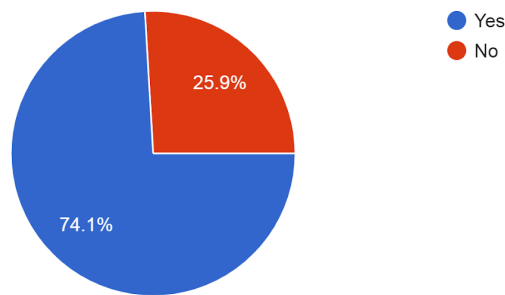
Would you like to share ideas on ways to improve and enrich the school experience for the future?
