## **HIGHLY CAPABLE 9-12 PROGRAM OPTIONS**

Identified Highly Capable students completing the Highly Capable Program at Brier Terrace Middle School, as well as those students tested and qualified during their 8th grade year, may elect placement in one of the following 9-12 program options:

- a. Enroll at Edmonds Woodway High School to pursue the International Baccalaureate Full Diploma.
- b. Enroll at Mountlake Terrace High School to pursue the STEM Magnet Program.
- c. Enroll at their neighborhood High School to pursue Honors in grades 9-10, and be guaranteed enrollment in available accelerated options including Advanced Placement (AP) and College in High School. Students will also be provided access to Running Start.

The following table provides a short overview of elements of these Accelerated Program choices and at which schools each is available. Please note that transportation is <u>not available</u> for students who elect to attend a high school out of their service area.
